Licensure exams: See *Integrated Social Studies - Adolescent Young Adult (7-12) sheet for required licensure exams. These exams are required for the license, but NOT for the major. As of March 2015, these Pearson Tests include: Assessment of Professional Knowledge: Adolescence to Young Adult (7-12) (Test #003) and Integrated Social Studies (Test #025).*

Foreign language requirement: For students pursuing Integrated Social Studies with AYA Social Studies 7-12 licensure, the foreign language requirement is waived. If the student changes majors and drops licensure, the requirement is reinstated for that student.
