Licensure exams: See Middle Childhood Major sheet for required <u>licensure</u> exams. These exams are required for the license, but <u>NOT</u> for the major. As of March 2015, these Pearson Tests include: Assessment of Professional Knowledge: (4-9)—Test #002 AND both content areas chosen.

Foreign language requirement: For students pursuing Middle Childhood (Grades 4-9) licensure, the foreign language requirement is waived. If the student changes majors and drops licensure, the requirement is reinstated for that student.
