Note 2: Students can take an additional psychology content course (PSYC 26100, 26200, 31600, 32700, 34400 or 36600) provided they have met the content requirement with at least one other course in each content domain.

Major Note: Students must earn a minimum grade of “C” in PSYC 10100, PSYC 21400, and 21500. Also, it is strongly recommended that majors enrich their background with an introductory course in computer programming, a field experience (29800) or internship (49800), an independent research project (48100) or special topics courses (28000, 281000)

Foreign language requirement note: students placing out of the foreign language requirement should take an elective, second major or minor course.
